- ❖ Deliver programming for our summer sports leagues (basketball, volleyball, flag football, and ultimate frisbee), Skills Academy, and Camp days.
- ❖ Building relationships with participants to ensure they are getting the most out of programming
- ❖ Set up & clean up locations and equipment
- ❖ Communicate with Program Coordinators about equipment or materials needed, limiting factors for programming, etc.
- ❖ Collaborate and support the team to ensure all Program Facilitators have the chance to grow and be successful in their roles
- ❖ Work independently and as a team player
